

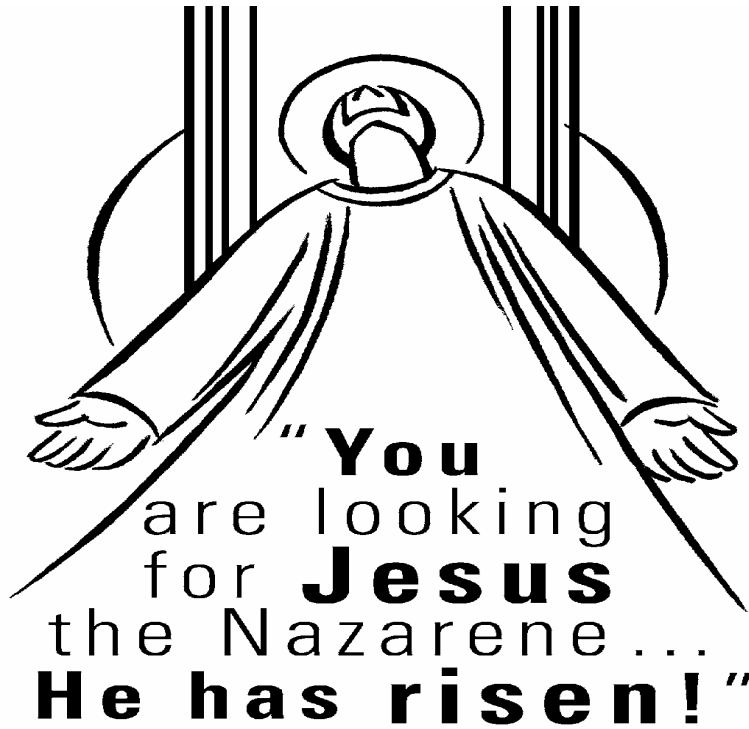

Mike's Message...

As we continue our discussion about Christianity in America, I would like to share with you some of the difference between "American Christianity" and "Biblical Christianity."

American Christianity goes something like this. Do you go to church anywhere? Yes, I go on Easter and Christmas. Do you give money to charities? Yes, I give money to the Boys and Girls club or the United Way once a year. Do you consider yourself a Christian? Of course, after all I have a Bible. You see, an American Christian is the person who thinks because they were born in America, they're Christian.

These are the ones who think that if the government legalizes something then it's okay to do. Or if society changes and states that this or that is now acceptable, then it must be okay because society has now accepted it as the norm.

There is also another line of thinking on this. It is "cultural Christianity." In an article published by *Modern Reformation Magazine*¹, J. I. Packer said, "There is such a thing as cultural Christianity, a Christianity that only goes skin deep and is taken in because it is part of the culture of your home or the group to which you belong. What you receive in this case, you receive by osmosis, rather than by any sort of thinking. When the time comes and the tough questions are asked your mind begins to wake up and you realize that all you've got is the veneer of a "Christian lifestyle" without any deeply rooted convictions at all. Culture Christianity is always a problem at this point. Those who have received it think that they are Christians because of the way that they have been conditioned."

Now, before I even go any farther, I must say that I feel very strongly that it is the church's fault this has happened. There was a big swing from the preaching of "hell fire" to "God is love;" the truth of the matter is we must have both. There must be an understanding that God is love, but He is also the coming Judge.

Biblical Christianity is not based upon the practices or beliefs of society. It is not based upon what the government says is okay or not okay, but it is based upon the Bible! Biblical Christianity teaches that we are to be different from the world in our talk, our dress, our passions, our marriages, our relationship to others, (Christians as well as non-Christians). Did you know that the divorce rate among those who call themselves Christian is higher than those outside of the church? Did you know that there are many who dress a certain way to catch the eye of a church leader? Did you know that the financial strain is greater for those in the church because of the **false** teaching of health, wealth, and prosperity?

Biblical Christianity is a lifestyle. It is not saying the right words at the right time. It is not wearing your best on Sunday morning, then behaving your worst the rest of the week. It is living a Christ-like life. It involves a daily surrendering of your life to Christ. It is studying God's word for your personal growth, as well as preparing to witness to others. It is putting God's word in your heart so that you will not sin against Him. It is being actively involved in a local congregation to reach the lost. It is truly about giving your **all** to the Master. I pray that all of us will be the example of "Biblical Christianity."

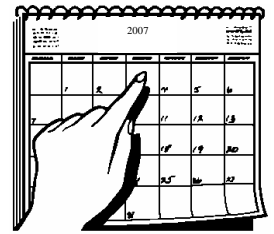

Chessy Chicken & Rice Casserole

Ingredients Needed

1 Can Cream of Chicken

1 Bag uncooked rice

1 1/3 cups of water

2 cups of your favorite vegetables

½ tsp. Onion powder

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

½ cup shredded Cheddar cheese

Stir the soup, water, rice, vegetables and onion powder in a 12" x 8" shallow baking dish.

Bake at 375° F, for 45 min. or until done. Top with cheese.
