Mike's Message... This month we will have an opportunity to be part of a historic moment in time. On the 10th of this month at 7:00 pm, John Riggs will be ordained into the ministry of Christ's work. This is a very monumental step for John and his family as well as this church. God has truly blessed us with the opportunity to ordain one of our own for His service.

Let's take a brief look at what it means to be ordained. To be ordained means to announce officially or make declaration of. It is also a type of decree which is made. In the Christian Church it has been a common practice to ordain elders and deacons. In that case, it means to officially announce to a local congregation men who desire to serve the Lord in a certain capacity. These men have been set apart for service, to minister to the flock in helping to meet their needs both physically as well as spiritually. This is a serious event in a person's life and should not to be taken lightly.

In John's case, he has announced that God has called him into the ministry and, therefore, he is answering that call. He is making an official announcement to answer God's call and in doing so, is declaring his willingness to pursue God as a full time servant. Yes, it is true that ALL believers are called to serve God, but to take the step to pursue serving the Lord on a full time basis is a great step of faith. John understands this concept and in doing so is preparing to take on a great responsibility of standing true in word and deed. He is making a declaration of his service to the King.

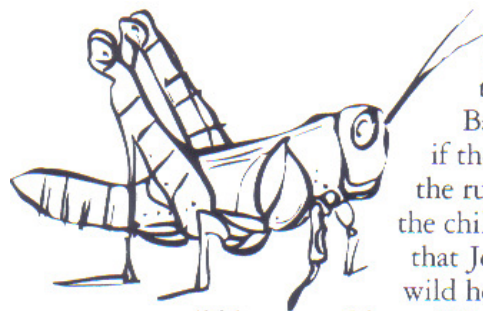

It is our responsibility to pray for John and Shelley. It is our responsibility to encourage them both as they face uncertainties along their journey. This, my friends, is a life-changing moment for John and Shelley as well as this congregation.
